## **UNFPA Supplies today**

"We are trying to get commodities to women and girls."

Since 2007, UNFPA Supplies' has:

- increased access to and use of modern contraceptives and maternal health medicines.
- enhanced capacity of national health systems to manage these supplies and to provide family planning, maternal health and HIV-prevention services
- helped family planning be prioritized at the highest levels of national policies, plans & programmes

UNFPA Supplies currently supports 46 UNFPA programme countries; additional countries in humanitarian crises; Pacific Island Countries; regional initiatives.

Catalyst for UNFPA's work, working in synergy with UNFPA initiatives and drawing on our strengths

Over US\$1.8 billion mobilized since inception in 2007. Trusted donor mechanism with strong M&E framework.

### The Case for Commitment

217 million women who want to avoid pregnancy are not using modern contraceptives.

If all unmet need for modern contraception were satisfied in developing regions, there would be:

- Two-thirds decline in unintended pregnancies
- Three-quarters decline in unsafe abortions
- One quarter reduction in maternal deaths

The COVID-19 pandemic is exacerbating existing challenges to SRHR.

Contraceptives provided through UNFPA Supplies 2007–2018 potentially averted an estimated:

89 million Unintended pregnancies

1.67 million Maternal and newborn deaths

26.8 million Unsafe abortions


And save families and countries \$3.6 billion in direct health-care costs



## Financing Landscape

- Previous crises demonstrate that ODA to SRHR will decline in line with the aid sector as a whole
- UNFPA revenue is more impacted by changes in political leadership of its major donor countries
- The COVID-19 crisis unprecedented in scale - could impact the future of UNFPA funding, as much as it has already impacted (SRHR) services needs across the world.

# The UNFPA Supplies Partnership: (2021-2030)

In Sept 2020, after 18+ months of consultation with the global community, Steering Committee endorsed new 10-year strategy.

**The Vision:** Transforming lives by building a world where everyone can access quality reproductive health supplies

The Partnership represents a new decade of global and country commitment to accelerate progress towards the Sustainable Development Goals.





## **PARTNERSHIP OUTCOME**

Women and girls are able to access and use a choice of quality RH/FP commodities whenever they want or need them.

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## Key Shifts in the Programme

Taking forward the most significant aspects of past progress, the Partnership builds on extensive programmatic experience, and will place an even greater priority on:



Gender equality and human rights



Sustainable financing with domestic resources



Tailored and targeted approaches to maximize impact based on need/opportunity



Visibility of commodities to the last miles, with performance, accountability, and assurance processes





## How We Work: Strategic Framework—the four pillars

**Overall Goal:** Contribute to ending unmet need for family planning and preventable maternal mortality by increasing access to high-quality modern contraceptives and life-saving maternal health medicines.

Availability and choice



Increase availability and quality-assured RH/FP commodities

Strengthening supply chains



Ensure RH/FP commodities reach the last mile and promote harmonization and integration of supply chains

Increased government commitment



Country financial contributions to quality RH/FP services are increased

RH/FP is prioritized as core element of sustainable development Operational effectiveness and efficiency



UNFPA demonstrates robust and accountable programme performance and oversight



## How We Work: Three Funding Streams



Funds allocated at global level

Allocated to countries based on need/opportunity

No fixed split in allocations

Contingent on validated supply plans



## How We Work: Three Funding Streams

#### **SUPPLIES**

Funds a range of contraceptives and maternal health medicines, including for humanitarian crises.

#### TRANSFORMATIVE ACTION

Funds to strengthen supply chains, improve policy, diversify financing, expand access to new and lesser-used methods.



#### **PERFORMANCE**

Funds to build capacity and strengthen accountability and visibility to the last mile, reaching areas most in need through effective and efficient use of resources.

## A Compact for Shared Commitment





The purpose of the Compact is to realize the goals of the programme, create greater transparency and accountability and clarify how the Partnership works:


- Objectives, terms, roles and responsibilities
- Commitments to gender equality and human rights and a shift to sustainable financing
- Contributions and responsibilities, e.g.
   customs clearance, storage and distribution
- Cooperation arrangements
- Timetable for programme delivery and contributions
- How to be "a partner in good standing"

## How We Work: County-Centered Operating Framework






## How We Work: Improved Governance Model



The Steering Committee is composed of members representing critical constituencies convened to solve problems and approve programme strategy, key documents and budgets based on recommendations from three target subcommittees: finance and risk; strategy and planning; and leadership

The Partners Assembly engages a broad base of partners from global, regional and country-levels for the purposes of governance, advocacy, knowledge- sharing from programme implementation, advocacy and resource mobilization

# Where We Work: Eligibility Criteria

Resource allocation is determined by key criteria:

- policies
- systems and capacity
- commitment to health generally
- and family planning in particular
- capability to deliver services and reach the last mile
- current financing level and approach

Three widely-used criteria to determine eligibility for inclusion



**GNI/per capita** (Atlas method)

Contraceptive prevalence rate (mCPR)

Maternal mortality ratio (MMR)

## Where We Work: A Pathway to Sustainable Transition

#### **COUNTRY TRANSITION**

Full programme countries have access to all resources in the Partnership. Most countries and most programme resources are in Stage 1 at the start.

#### Countries are eligible for:

- · Routine commodities
- · New and lesser-used commodities
- Additional third party procurement incentive support
- Transformative Action funding stream
- · Performance funding stream

Countries enter a stepped-down approach while shifting to the next stage, technical support.

#### Countries are eligible for:

- Step-down matching arrangements for routine commodities
- Additional third party procurement incentive support
- Application for new and lesser-used commodities
- Application to the Transformative Action funding stream
- · Performance funding stream

Countries are eligible for support through UNFPA Regional Office as well as some Partnership resources including:


- Technical support from Regional Offices
- Application for matching support for new and lesser-used commodities (for product introduction)
- Limited procurement support/incentive for third party procurement
- Limited application to the Transformative Action stream subject to funding availability
- Limited funds from Performance stream
