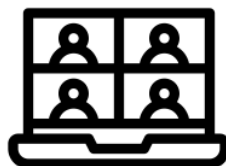
Goodness Ogeyi Odey

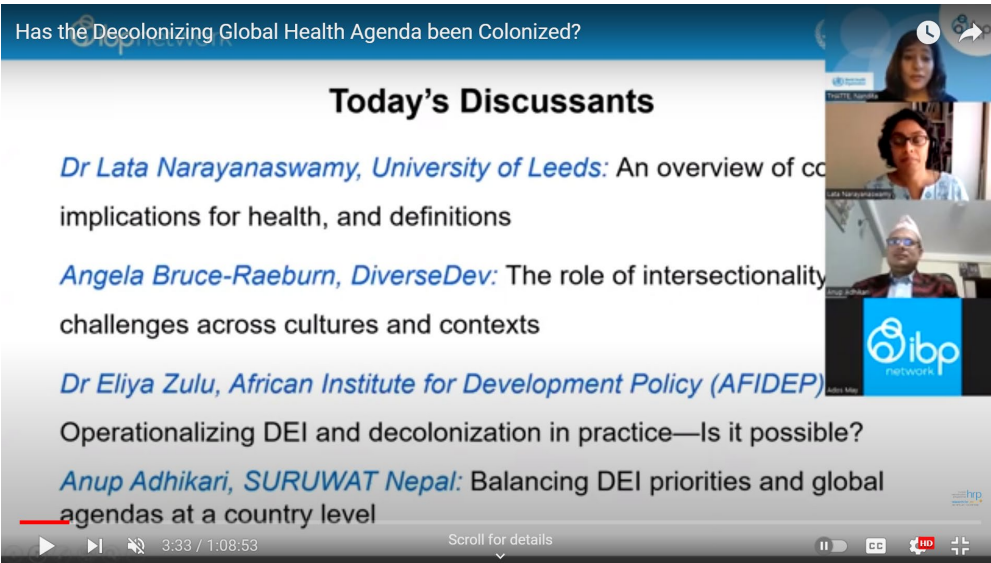

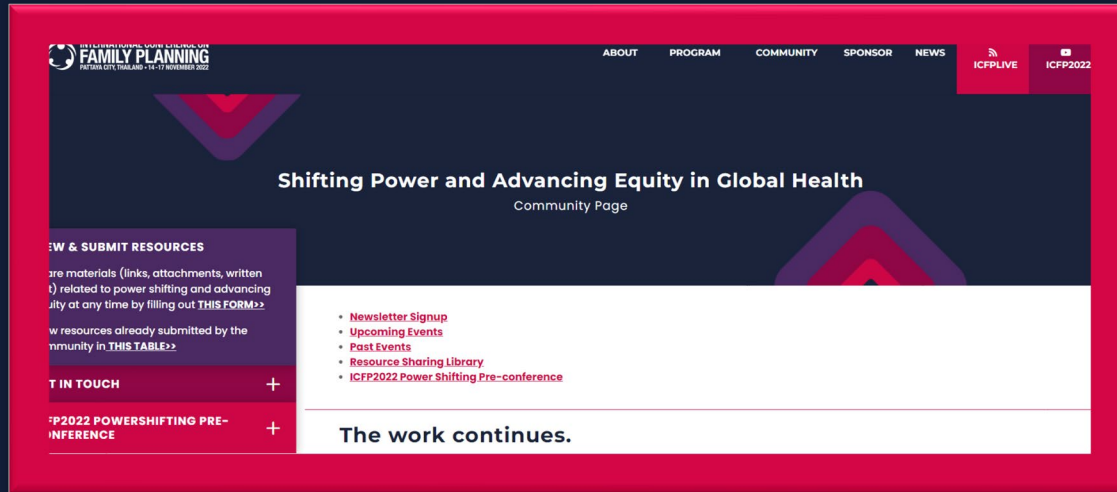

Ernest W Wyson is the President & CEO of CBOs Coalition for Human Rights and Governance (CBOs-CHRGG). He brings in over 25 years experience in working with small grassroots organisations in Malawi. Having held several key positions in finance and program management with various INGOs, LNGOs and other development agencies including CBOs, he championed for the birth of this first of its kind national Coalition of CBOs in collaboration with other CBOs leaders who saw the need for the voice of CBOs in Malawi in 2018. During his leadership at the CBOs Coalition, has seen the Coalition growing its membership from 20 CBOs to over 1000 CBOs and has established district chapters across all the 28 districts in Malawi which are at a peak in leading governance, HIV, health, social justice and bringing together CBOs and communities for unified support and advocacy action in addressing issues of mutual concern, including community systems strengthening.



William Otuck

William Otuck is a Tanzanian Sexual Reproductive Health and Rights advocate and expert with a particular interest and focus on youth leadership and gender. With an academic background in clinical medicine, William has spent the past eight years working with young people on sexual and reproductive health issues through community awareness programs, capacity building, policy advocacy (at the local, national, and international level), and research. His career journey has led him to co-found and work for various youth-led organizations that aim at amplifying young people's voices into decision-making platforms while nurturing a workforce of future advocates and change-makers. William is currently a managing director for the Young And Alive Initiative (YAAI), a youth-led organization based in Tanzania working to advance sexual reproductive health and rights through a gender lens and youth leadership.
